Japanese Language Education Division

The Group has welcomed international students from over 120 countries and regions, offering education through eight schools across Japan. Each year, more than 10,000* international students study Japanese language and culture. Our goal is to be an industry leader in the Japanese language education sector, excelling in both quality and scale.

Admissions Preparation Services Division

The Admissions Preparation Services for international students became one of the new ventures of the WEWORLD Group in 2023. Through collaboration with ISI Japanese Language School and the development of a seamless education framework, we aim to offer a more practical and efficient educational program.



College Education Division

The campuses located in Ikebukuro, Tokyo and Ueda, Nagano offer an international and multicultural environment. Our aim is for both international and Japanese students to develop global perspectives, specialized expertise, and personal competencies, while acquiring business knowledge and language skills to prepare them for the global workforce.



University Administration Division

We operate the Tokyo campus of Beijing Language and Culture University, a national university of China. We offer advanced Chinese language and cultural education to nurture Chinese language specialists. In addition to language proficiency, we aim to cultivate global talent with the skills needed to thrive across Asia.



Study Abroad Division

ISI Kokusai Gakuin offers a wide variety of study abroad options, including overseas high school diploma programs, credit transfer study abroad programs, short-term study programs, and language school courses for a diverse demographic, from parents and children to seniors. Additional offerings include English-language domestic study programs, the Peking University Health Science Center Medical Educational Program, and overseas internships.

■ Higher education advancement record

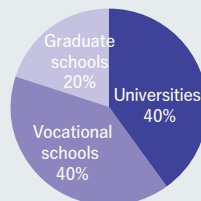

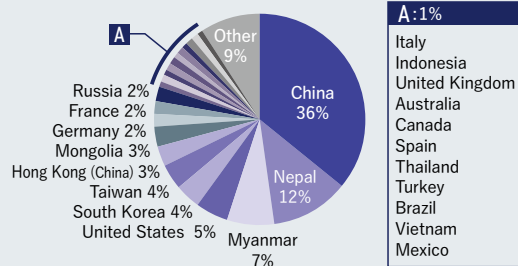
Breakdown of higher education admissions

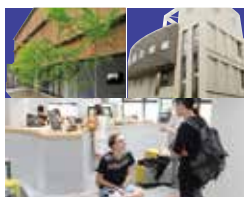

This school opened in Machida City, Tokyo, in 2004 and relocated to Ikebukuro in 2014. In 2020, its Global Business Department was accredited as an Applied Professional Postsecondary Course. It leverages unique programs and learning platforms developed through collaborations with overseas universities and companies, to educate students and cultivate business professionals with global and digital mindsets.

Vocational school Nagano Business and Language College (NBL)

In 1992, the school was established as a Japanese language school in Ueda City, Nagano Prefecture. It was later renamed Nagano Language College (vocational school) and subsequently Nagano Business and Language College (vocational school). In 2022, its Global Business Department also received accreditation as an Applied Professional Postsecondary Course. The school develops individuals equipped with business expertise, language and communication skills, and cross-cultural adaptability essential for success in a global society.

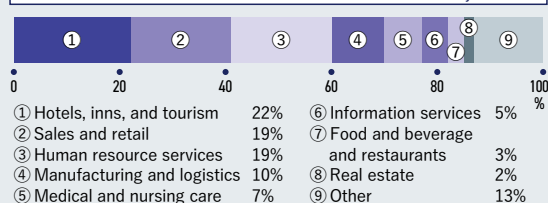

Ratio of students with job offers (March 2024 Graduates)

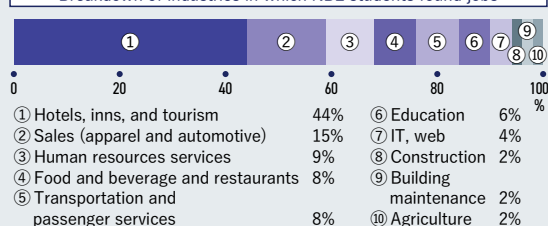

WEWORLD's University Management Division offers Chinese language education at a high level and fosters global talent that will serve as the bridge for Japan-China friendship.

Beijing Language and Culture University, Tokyo College

In 2015, the Beijing Language and Culture University, Tokyo College—the first branch of a Chinese national university in Japan—opened as a Japanese school accredited by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology. The school follows a curriculum based on Beijing School's direct teaching method, utilizing small-group, participatory classes that have been developed and refined over 60 years. This approach aims to nurture individuals who can act as bridges of friendship between Japan and China. Through this curriculum, students not only gain advanced Chinese language proficiency but also acquire professional knowledge and skills, preparing them to succeed in a global environment.

■ Mobile Campus – All eligible students who wish to study abroad have the opportunity to attend the main campus in Beijing.

The Mobile Campus system allows second and third-year students at Tokyo College to study at the Beijing campus for one or two years, where they can gain practical language skills and deepen their cultural understanding. Since the study period in Beijing counts as part of their enrollment, and the credits earned are recognized, students can still graduate in four years, including their time spent in Beijing.

■ Conveniently located in Ikebukuro, Tokyo

This urban campus is ideally situated just a four-minute walk from the east exit of Ikebukuro Station. It is well-equipped, featuring a library where students can access a rich collection of Chinese language and culture books, along with Japanese resources.

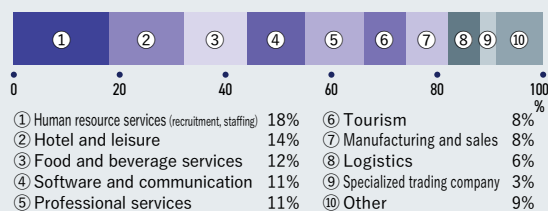
■ Ratio of students with job offers (March 2024 Graduates)

■ Beijing Language and Culture University

Founded in 1962, Beijing Language and Culture University is an international university with its primary mission being to teach Chinese language and culture to foreign students. Its accumulated research on teaching the Chinese language and culture to international learners is unrivaled, and its expertise has been used all over the world. Since the school atmosphere is based on the mixture of various languages and values, it is often called a 'mini United Nations'.

■ Long-term study abroad (for high school students) and short-term study abroad (for junior high and elementary school students)

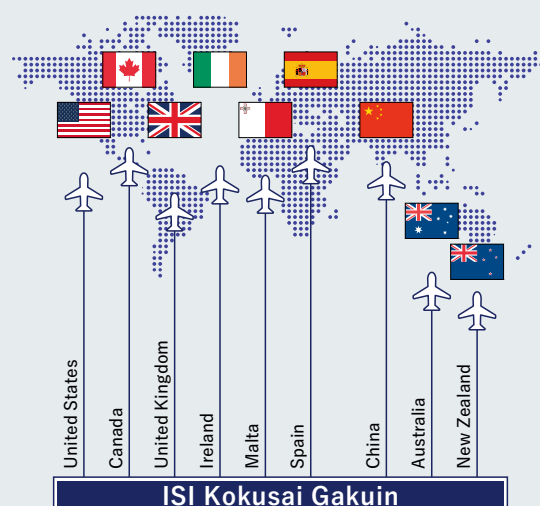

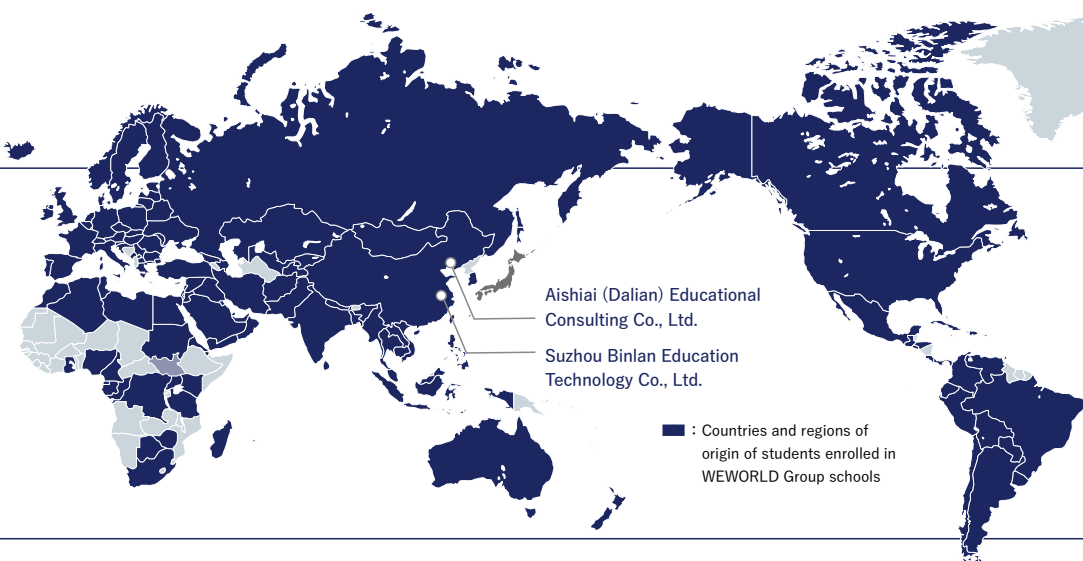

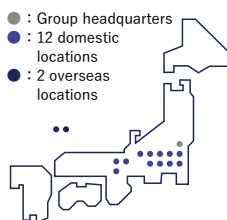

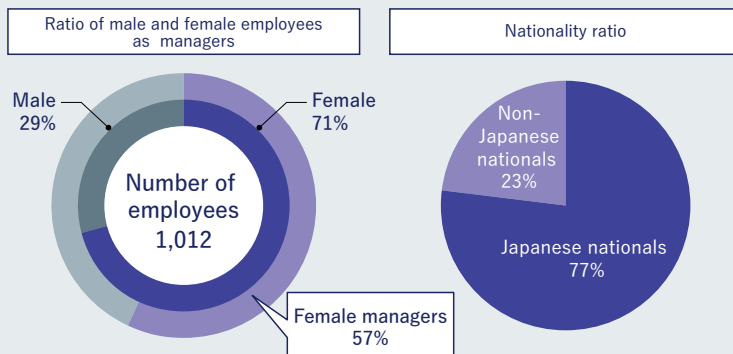


Diversity management

With the goal of enabling everyone to fully utilize their unique potential, regardless of gender or nationality, we aim for at least 50% of managerial positions to be held by women and 20% of employees to be foreign nationals. Society in harmony with the environment

To conserve resources and protect the environment, we are actively reducing paper and electricity consumption while volunteering to clean up trash in our community.

■ Paperless, electricity conservation, and energy conservation challenges

For fiscal year 2024, we aim to reduce paper consumption per person by 5% (compared to FY 2023) and maintain current electricity consumption levels. To achieve this, we are reducing paper use through digital education, implementing the Electronic Book Storage Act, and outsourcing mass printing. Efforts to reduce electricity usage include installing LED bulbs, minimizing overtime, and enforcing strict lights-out policies. We are also encouraging employee participation in sustainability initiatives to further enhance our efforts.





Contribution to peace

With the ultimate goal of building a peaceful society that accepts everyone, we provide education as a means to assist refugees. Additionally, we organize international exchange events to promote cross-cultural understanding and harmony.



■ Our refugee relief activities have supported 66 people (2022-2025)

This assistance is intended to help refugees integrate into Japanese society and build hope for the future. 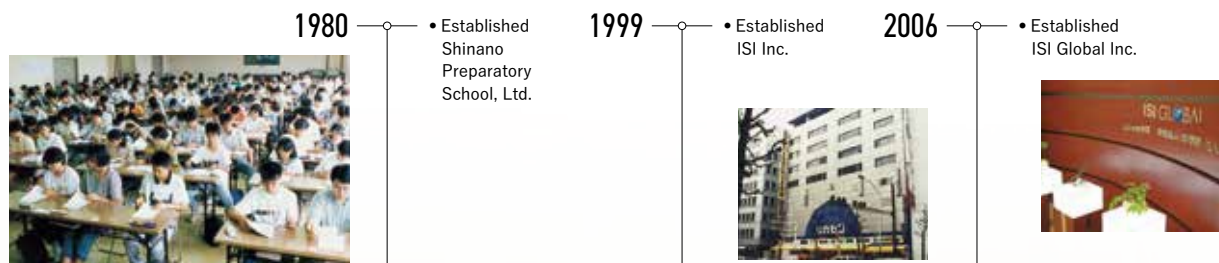

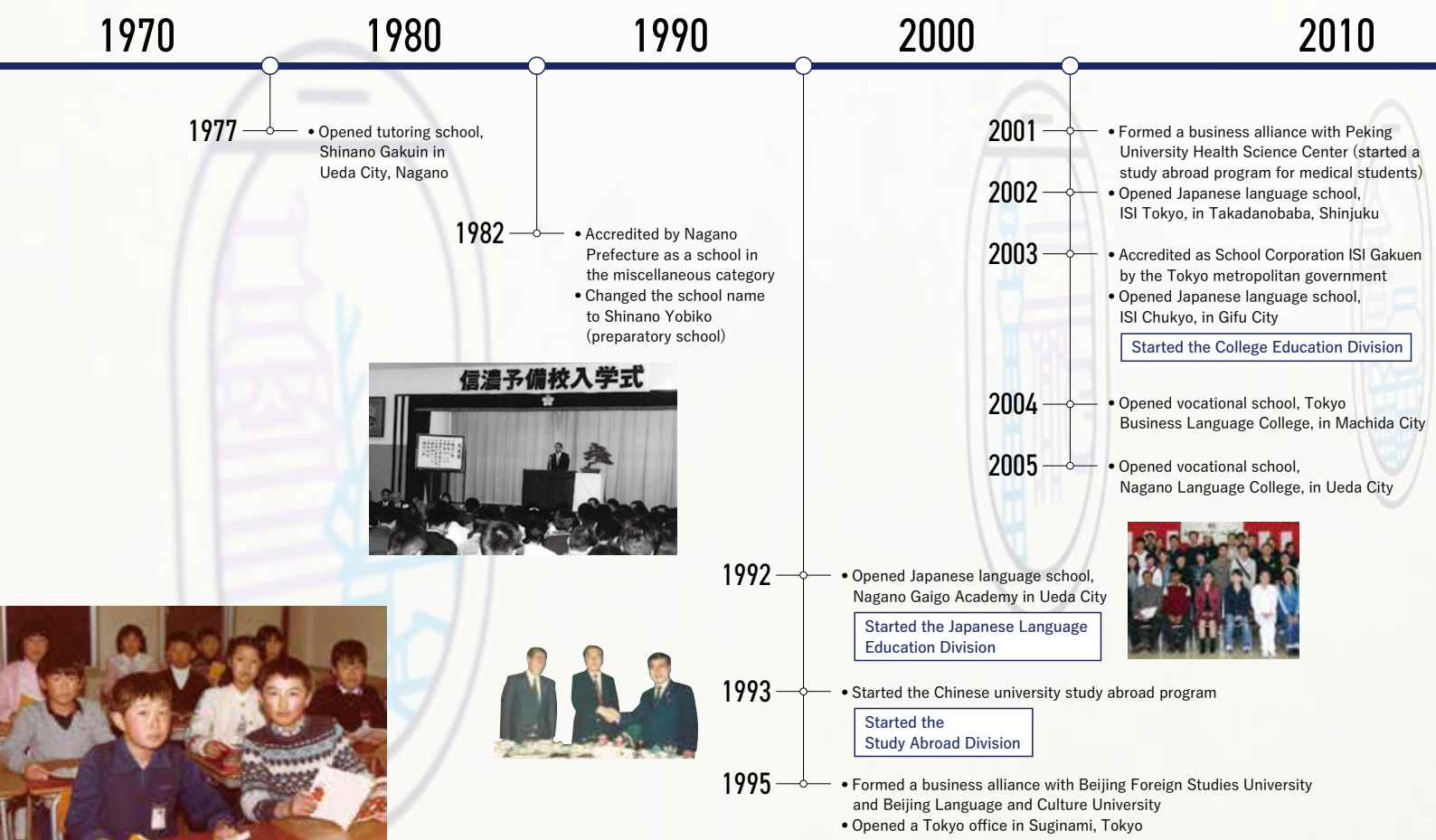

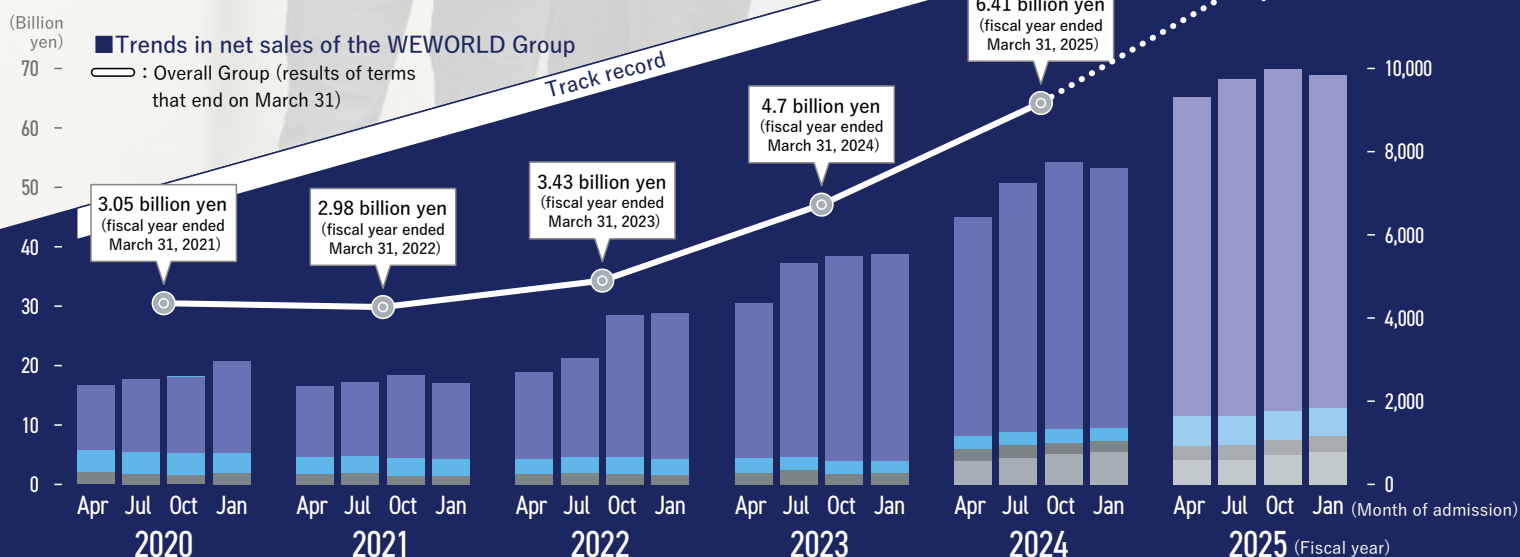
