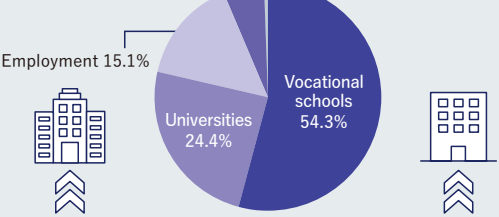

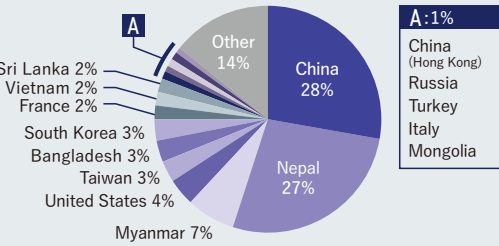
Graduate Outcomes Breakdown

This school opened in Machida City, Tokyo, in 2004 and relocated to Ikebukuro in 2014. In 2020, its Global Business Department was accredited as an Applied Professional Postsecondary Course. It leverages unique programs and learning platforms developed through collaborations with overseas universities and companies, to educate students and cultivate business professionals with global and digital mindsets.

In 1992, the school was established as a Japanese language school in Ueda City, Nagano Prefecture. It was later renamed Nagano Language College (vocational school) and subsequently Nagano Business and Language College (vocational school). In 2022, its Global Business Department also received accreditation as an Applied Professional Postsecondary Course. The school develops individuals equipped with business expertise, language and communication skills, and cross-cultural adaptability essential for success in a global society.

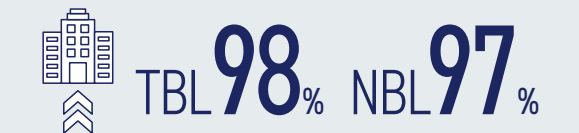

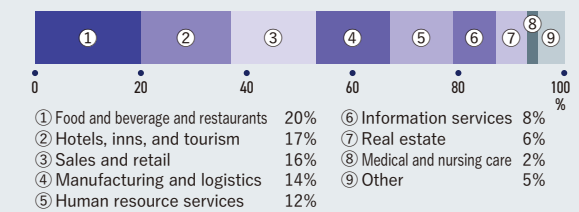

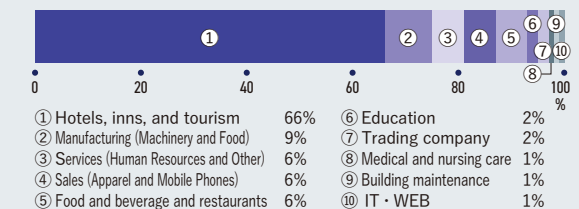

WEWORLD's University Management Division offers Chinese language education at a high level and fosters global talent that will serve as the bridge for Japan-China friendship.

Beijing Language and Culture University, Tokyo College

In 2015, the Beijing Language and Culture University, Tokyo College—the first branch of a Chinese national university in Japan—opened as a Japanese school accredited by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology. The school follows a curriculum based on Beijing School's direct teaching method, utilizing small-group, participatory classes that have been developed and refined over 60 years. This approach aims to nurture individuals who can act as bridges of friendship between Japan and China. Through this curriculum, students not only gain advanced Chinese language proficiency but also acquire professional knowledge and skills, preparing them to succeed in a global environment.

■ Mobile Campus – All eligible students who wish to study abroad have the opportunity to attend the main campus in Beijing.

The Mobile Campus system allows second and third-year students at Tokyo College to study at the Beijing campus for one or two years, where they can gain practical language skills and deepen their cultural understanding. Since the study period in Beijing counts as part of their enrollment, and the credits earned are recognized, students can still graduate in four years, including their time spent in Beijing.

This urban campus is ideally situated just a four-minute walk from the east exit of Ikebukuro Station. It is well-equipped, featuring a library where students can access a rich collection of Chinese language and culture books, along with Japanese resources.

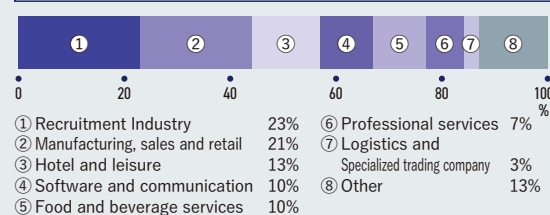

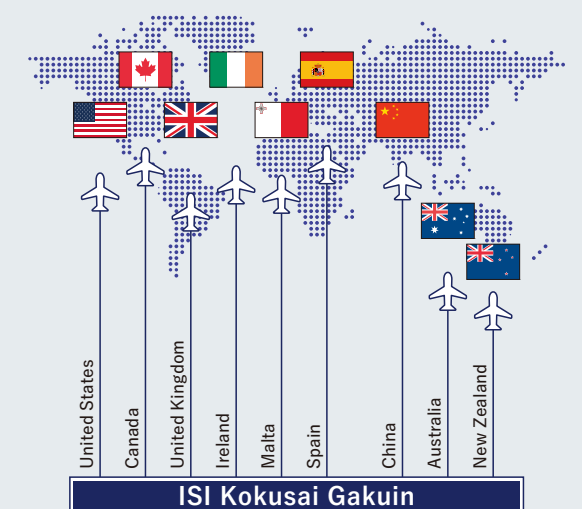

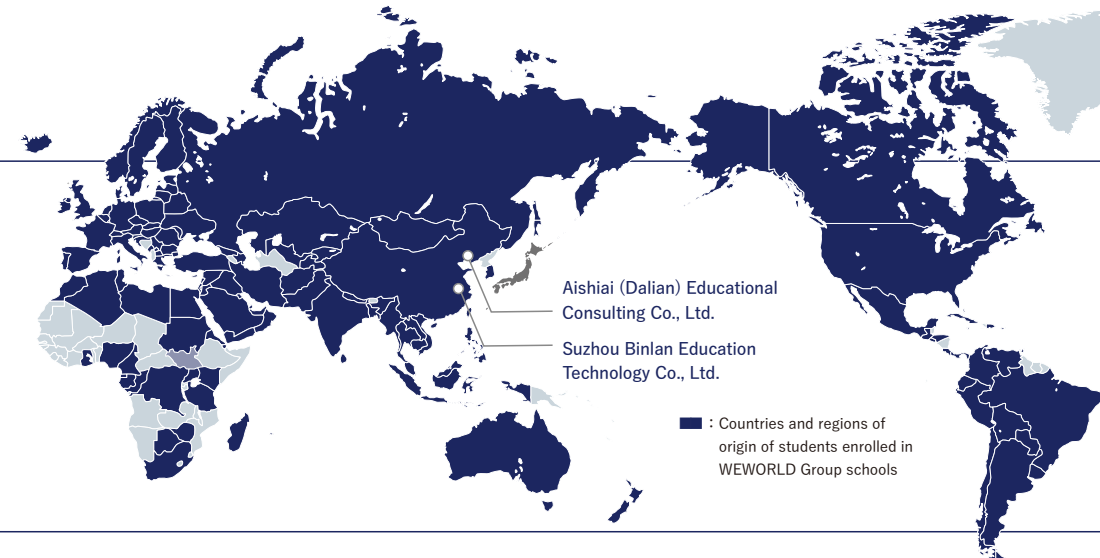

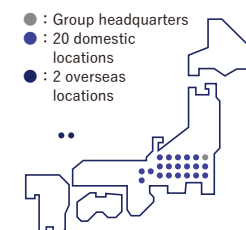

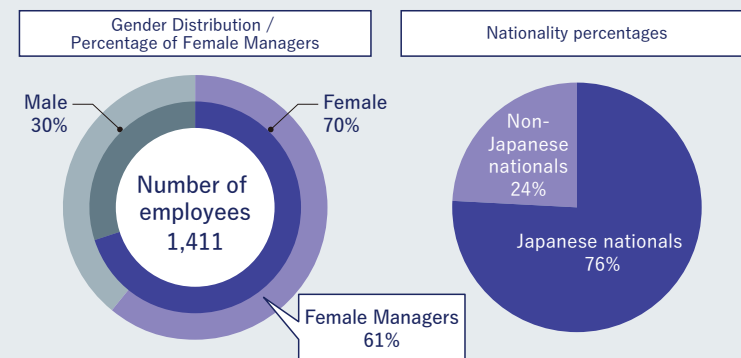


Diversity management

Society in harmony with the environment

To conserve resources and protect the environment, we are actively reducing paper and electricity consumption while volunteering to clean up trash in our community.

■ Paperless, electricity conservation, and energy conservation challenges

For fiscal year 2026, we aim to reduce paper consumption per employee by 5% while maintaining current electricity consumption levels. To achieve this, we are reducing paper use by promoting digital education through AI-powered learning applications and digital teaching materials, as well as introducing electronic whiteboards and outsourcing high-volume printing. Efforts to reduce electricity consumption include upgrading to LED lighting, minimizing overtime, and enforcing lights-out policies.



Contribution to peace

With the ultimate goal of building a peaceful society that accepts everyone, we provide education as a means to assist refugees. Additionally, we organize international exchange events to promote cross-cultural understanding and harmony.

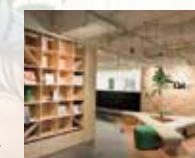

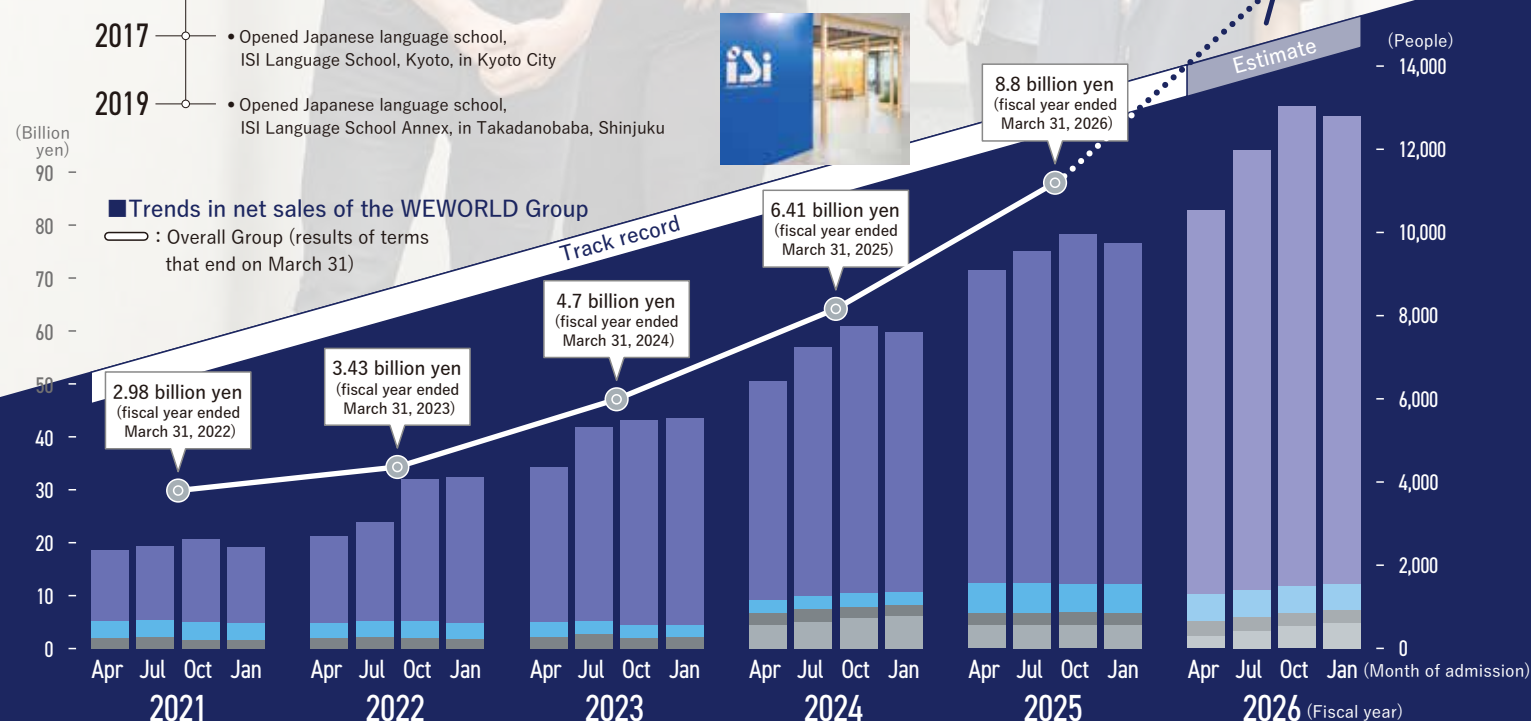
